- Looking for sites in Southern Oregon, Northern Washington

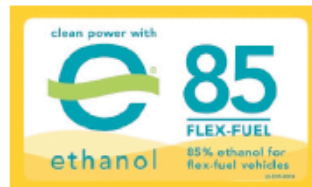

Oregon vehicle license records show that you may have a **Flex Fuel Vehicle (FFV)** capable of running on E85 or 100% gasoline. (E85 is a term used for fuel containing 85% ethanol and 15% gasoline.)

- Ethanol-enriched fuel is a cleaner burning, renewable fuel that lowers tailpipe emissions and greenhouse gasses that contribute to global climate change. Ethanol is good for our economy because it is American made and reduces our dependence on foreign oil.
- E85 typically is priced to be competitive with 87-octane gasoline. E85 is usually less expensive than regular unleaded fuel.
- To determine if your vehicle can be fueled with E85 check your owner's manual or gas cap. Additional information on FFVs can be found at www.E85.org.
